

Mental Capacity Act & Liberty Protection Safeguards (LPS)

In May 2019, the Mental Capacity (Amendment) Act became law. It replaces the Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards (DoLS) with a new scheme known as the Liberty Protection Safeguards (LPS). The new law seeks to protect the liberty of people who do not have the mental capacity to make decisions about their care, and to simplify the DoLS system.

Course Aims

The course aims are to raise awareness of The Mental Capacity Act and Liberty Protection Safeguards (LPS) in the workplace. This will enable care staff to highlight any incidents where deprivation of liberty may need to be assessed.

Course Objectives

- 1) Define what Liberty Protection Safeguards means.
- 2) Discuss the key requirements of The Mental Capacity Act.
- 3) Identify clients whom they care for who have capacity.
- 4) Identify clients whom they care for who do not have capacity.
- 5) Decide what constitutes a deprivation of liberty.
- 6) Describe the key people involved in the care of the client who work in partnership for a client without capacity and discuss their role in person centred care for the client.
- 7) Identify the assessment process required for assessing both mental capacity and the authorisation for deprivation of liberty.
- 8) List the 5 aims of capacity and discuss the tests required to decide if a person has capacity.
- 9) Discuss possible areas where this could be difficult e.g. communication barriers with clients.

- 12) Discuss the role of the independent mental capacity advocate and the relationship with decision making in relation to a person who does not have capacity.


